# Critically Discerning

**Healthcare Seeking**. Delays seeking health care except for serious illness or injury; tends to be indifferent to the cost of health care as factor influencing this delay. Health Care Cost Concern. Leans towards being less likely to select a doctor or hospital based on price and only moderately unlikely to compare care providers in order to save money.

Trust in Medical Professionals. Indifference to believing in the competence of medical professionals, but a tendency to believe that medical professionals often prescribe treatments without knowledge of all the side effects.

Family Health Decisions. Somewhat strong internal locus of control around family health care decisions associated with a disliking of being in charge of health care decisions.

Family Health Responsibility. Tends to take responsibility for family health along with indifference to accepting average health for family members.

Physical Fitness. Somewhat low level of participation in regular vigorous physical activity, but somewhat higher level of aspiring to higher physical fitness.

Nutritional Focus. Indifference to attention to nutritional fitness.

Health Information Seeking. Indifferent to seeking health information to understand treatment options and to compare health care providers prior to use.

Health Proactive. Firmly leans towards being health reactive and dealing with health issues when they arise.

Locus of Control. Leans toward an internal locus of control around health care decisions for self. Tends to moderately follow health practices learned from parents. **Quality Focus.** Strong belief that the quality care is associated with higher cost.





Average % Conformity to Pattern by Percentile: PATH 1: Critically Discerning



Adults conform to their dominant PATH to different degrees. Sorting adults dominated by the Critically Discerning pattern from the lowest percentage conformity to highest percentage conformity, the above graph illustrates the average conformity across ten percentiles. The majority of adults dominated by the Critically Discerning PATH 1 adhere to it at greater than 60% conformity, indicating that the majority "pool" close to this pattern.
